Hit the road, Jack: RV safety tips to keep that trip on course

Road trips in a RV can be a blast, but driving one comes with many challenges. Our friends at Auto-Owners have put together a comprehensive list of things to keep in mind so you can enjoy the ride:

1. Make sure your route is RV-friendly. Consider using an RV-specific GPS device or a Trucker Atlas to avoid low bridges and other restrictions on your route.
2. Give yourself plenty of room when making a turn. Take time to practice making turns and backing up before your trip in a large, empty parking lot.
3. Write down the height and weight of your RV and store it in the dash. As you drive, pay attention to the clearance signs posted on most overpasses. Keep in mind some gas station and restaurant drive-thru canopies may be shorter than your RV.
4. Check your state's license requirements. Some states require special non-commercial licenses for driving certain classes of RVs.
5. Before you get behind the wheel, consider taking an RV driving course.
7. Include safety essentials in your packing list: first-aid kit, fire extinguisher, jumper cables, duct tape, tire pressure gauge, batteries, battery charger, etc.
8. Don't forget insurance! Talk with your local, independent agent about RV insurance. Adding RVs to an existing policy is generally an easy process. You will want to make sure you have adequate coverage in case of an accident.
