Water Safety 101

Summer is just better on the lake, right? But having a fun day on the water includes getting everyone back to shore safely. Whether you are the captain or just along for the ride, everyone plays a critical role in safety. We can all use a refresher on the laws, best practices, and potentially life-saving tips while boating:

- Do not exceed the number of passengers safely allowed on your boat.
- All persons born after January 1, 1984, who operates a boat in Missouri must have a boating safety ID card (issued by the highway patrol) or a MO driver's license on board.
- Children should wear a life jacket at all times – this is required by law in Missouri for kids under the age of 7. For adults, there must be a U.S. Coast Guard-approved life jacket available for each passenger.
- Shut off the engine while passengers are loading and unloading for recreational activities such as tubing, waterskiing, wakeboarding, and swimming.
- In Missouri, a "skier down/person in the water" flag – in either bright red or orange – is required equipment on a boat.
- Frequently monitor gauges (voltage, temperature, fuel) to ensure safe operation and identify any issues as soon as possible. And in Missouri, most boats are required to have a U.S. Coast Guard-approved fire extinguisher.
- Be aware of your surroundings, like lake and weather conditions, plus any other watercraft.
- The primary driver should abstain from consuming any alcoholic beverages prior to or during the outing.
